INJECTABLE TOXIN AND FILLER POLICY

Pricing for toxin and Sculptra

Toxin and Sculptra is charged by the unit/cc at all visits including two week touch up visits for toxin.

Pricing for filler

Filler is charged by the syringe. A syringe must be used in its entirety at treatment. Filler cannot be saved for a later visit. Full correction of an area may require more than what is initially predicted during consultation. It is up to the patient if they wish to continue treatment to full correction.

Post procedure bruising and swelling

Any time an injection is performed, there is a risk of bruising and swelling. These side effect are usually resolved by two weeks. Bruising after injection can be affected by medications such as aspirin, vitamin E, fish oil, ibuprofen, and other NSAID anti-inflammatory medication. Patients should not take these medications for one week prior to injection. Ice applied to the area of injection can reduce swelling. Arnica, a homeopathic anti-inflammatory, can also be used to help reduce bruising after injection. It is also advised to avoid exercise for four hours following toxin and for 24 hours following filler injection.

Massage

Massage is recommended after injection of Sculptra following a 5-5-5 plan (five minutes, five times a day, five days). For other areas, massage can be performed if a bump is noticed once swelling begins to dissipate. It is expected that the filler can be felt under the skin initially, but it should not be seen as a bump. Dr. DeLuca-Pytell will perform massage after injection as needed, but prophylactic massage is not recommended.
